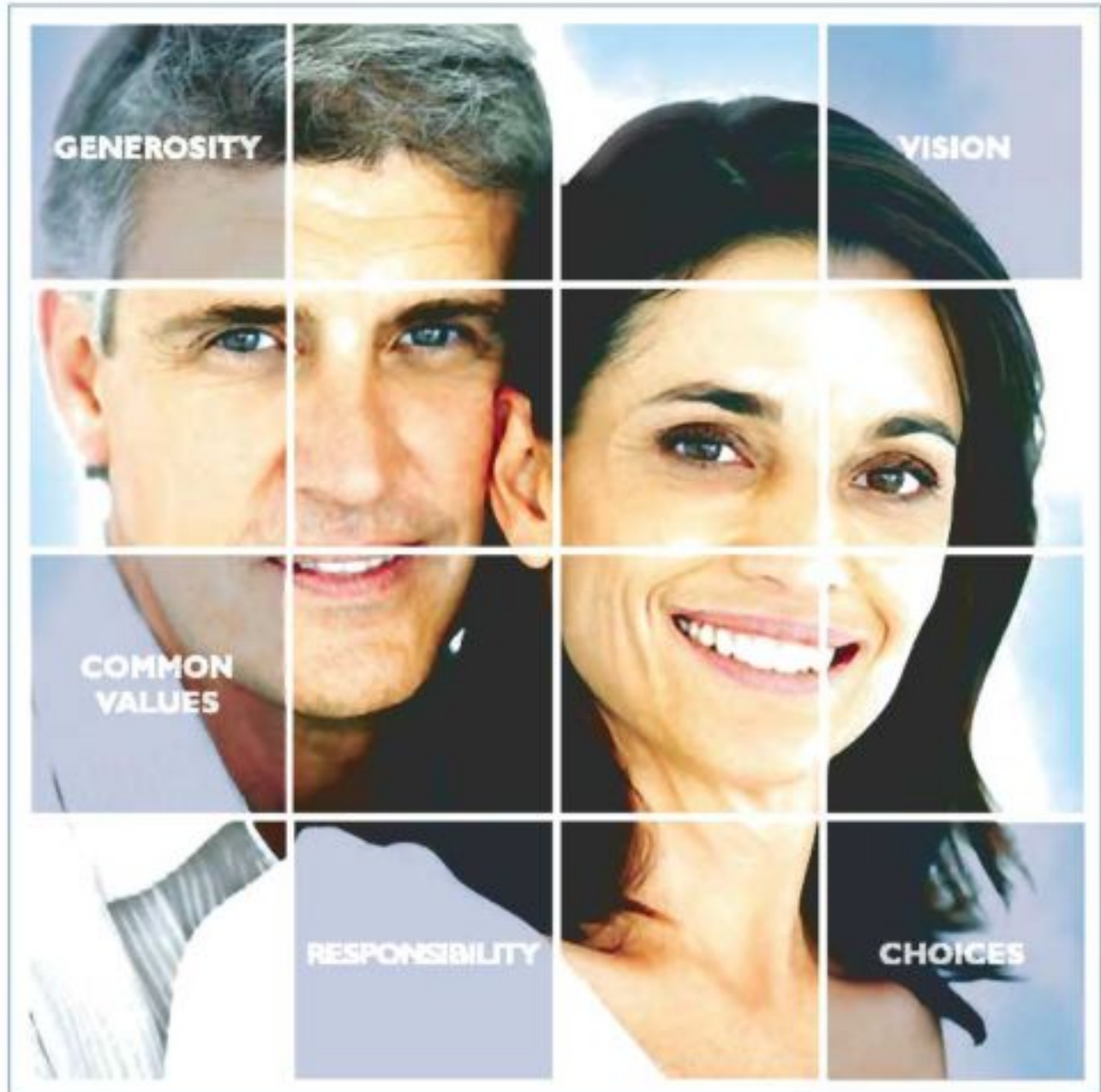

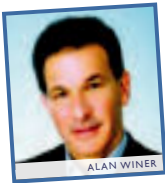

WHAT IS A COMMUNITY FOUNDATION?

Charities, historically, were established by a group of individuals interested in making a difference in a particular area of people's lives. Each charity could be labeled by its specific mission.

Today, the communal needs are so vast that many charities exist to address these numerous priorities. In order to foster a sense of community in charitable giving, the Jewish community established UJA Federation of Greater Toronto, as the one-stop-shop not-for-profit charitable equivalent of a retail superstore. Providing donors the ability to pinpoint their philanthropic efforts on whatever needs exist, at any given time, is accomplished through the Federation's endowment and planned giving arm, the Jewish Foundation of Greater Toronto.

How community foundations work

Community foundations are essentially local entities with deep roots in the community they serve. Both their employees and outside advisors have a wide range of expertise in assisting donors, providing personalized service and solutions based on the unique motivation of each individual and current communal needs.

A donor can make arrangements that leave him or her with flexibility in the timing and distribution of gifts. Foundations can tap into multiple sources of funding for a given cause by coordinating grants, matching funds and utilizing other resources.

Foundations can offer donors a diverse set of funding vehicles for charitable giving. Gifts to unrestricted funds give foundations the ability to deploy assets where they are needed most. Donor advised funds allow donors to recommend where money will go and the purpose for which it will be used. With professional advisors, including lawyers and accountants, foundations are usually familiar with the most recent advances in estate planning.



WHAT IS AN ENDOWMENT FUND?

An endowment fund is a sum of money held in perpetuity, whereby a certain percentage of interest is distributed annually to charitable endeavours.

Choices and Possibilities

- ▶ **DONOR ADVISED FUNDS**
A Donor Advised Fund is just what the name implies: a donor establishes a fund at the Foundation with a contribution of cash or other assets. The donor then can recommend distributions from the investment income to the charities of his/her choice.
- ▶ **PERPETUAL ANNUAL CAMPAIGN ENDOWMENT FUNDS**
Creating a Perpetual Annual Campaign Endowment (PACE) ensures that your contribution to United Jewish Appeal's Annual Campaign continues indefinitely, continuously changing lives and meeting the needs of Jewish Toronto long into the future.
- ▶ **DESIGNATED FUNDS**
In an ever-changing world, designated funds provide a stream of permanent income to safeguard the programs and organizations that matter most to you and your family.
- ▶ **FIELD OF INTEREST FUNDS**
Target your charitable giving to broadly-designated spheres of interest. Support programs that enhance quality of life for our elders, promote educational experiences for our young, advance Jewish arts and culture, or strengthen links between Canadian and Israeli Jews.
- ▶ **UNRESTRICTED FUNDS**
When you create an unrestricted fund, you provide sustaining financial resources to address opportunities and needs within the community. This ensures the community has emerging funds available to fulfill the highest principles of *tikun olam*.
- ▶ **YOUTH PHILANTHROPY FUNDS**
When young people in our community are approaching the time of their Bar or Bat Mitzvah, they have the opportunity to get involved in a *tzedakah* project that is both personally satisfying and of value to the community. Creating a Youth Philanthropy Fund in their own name introduces them to a lifelong habit of philanthropy, exposing them to a diverse group of Jewish organizations that are working to improve Jewish lives at home, in Israel and around the world. Each year they will recommend distributions from their fund to the charity of their choice. Establishing a Youth Philanthropy Fund encourages our teens to be philanthropists and future leaders in our community.

WHAT IS A PLANNED GIFT?

A Planned Gift is a charitable gift of life insurance or a bequest in a will, thus creating an endowment fund whose impact of giving lives on forever.

WHY LEAVE A GIFT FOR THE FUTURE?

Your commitment to the Jewish community is evident in everything you do. Creating your Jewish legacy extends your commitment into the future.

A legacy gift will keep our Jewish community strong for generations. It's an expression of your trust in future community leaders. It's a way for you to be there whenever help is needed. It's your sacred covenant with the Jewish people.

Jewish tradition teaches that one of our key duties is to make the world a better place for future generations. Whether you leave a bequest in your will, make a gift of life insurance or create your Jewish legacy using another estate planning vehicle, your generosity can do a world of good.

Your legacy can reflect everything that is most important and meaningful to you.

WOMEN'S LOJE

A minimum \$5,000 donation to UJA's Annual Campaign by establishing an endowment fund or a planned gift with a minimum \$100,000 commitment.

STAR OF DAVID

A permanent endowment fund of \$200,000 or more to create a Perpetual Annual Campaign Endowment (PACE) gift of \$10,000 or more.

PLATINUM LEGACY

A legacy of \$1 million or more in the form of a permanent endowment fund or a planned gift.

DONOR ADVISED FUNDS

This type of fund allows the donor and designated advisors to recommend distributions from the fund according to their areas of interest.



LEADING BY EXAMPLE

SYDNEY G. FRANKFORT

When it comes to giving back to the Jewish community, Sydney Frankfort clearly leads by example.

“One of the most important life lessons taught to me by my parents was to give and to be there for others,” says Sydney, who, true to his words, has a Donor Advised Fund with the Jewish Foundation. “*Tzedakah* was always important in our family. My father, Morris, was an extremely devoted humanitarian.

There probably wasn’t a cause or need in this community that he didn’t contribute to in some way – in time or money.”

Following the philanthropic trail blazed by his father, Sydney’s Donor Advised Fund with the Jewish Foundation supports a number of cultural, educational and healthcare initiatives.

“One of the most important life lessons taught to me... was to give and to be there for others.”

“I support Jewish organizations because I feel strongly about the survival of Jewish people and it’s the right thing to do,” asserts Sydney. “I am particularly interested in supporting healthcare, education, and culture. I suppose I inherited the interest in the latter from my mother, Ida, who was very passionate about arts and culture and inspired my appreciation.”

Also active as an Executive Board Member of the Canada Israel Cultural Foundation since its inception in 1963, Sydney clearly wants to inspire others.

“What’s a legacy? I suppose making a difference to others is worthwhile,” he muses. “I hope my story in some way inspires others to find their own way to give – and to tell their own story of *tzedakah* because together we will create a much more powerful Jewish legacy.”

TZEDAKAH AS A WAY OF LIFE

As a community volunteer and donor, Mitchell Oelbaum has long understood the importance of giving back to one's community.

Not one to be satisfied merely talking the talk, Mitchell and his siblings, along with his mother Annette, recently established an endowment fund with the Jewish Foundation to honour the memory of his late father, Ronald.

The Perpetual Annual Campaign Endowment (PACE) fund named for Ronald and Annette will go towards supporting the United Jewish Appeal's Annual Campaign long after they're gone.

"I've been very involved in the UJA Annual Campaign for the last several years now," explains Mitchell, who along with wife Naomi, has three children, Daniel, 16, Aaron, 14 and Ronnie, 9. "The UJA Campaign reaches a lot of people in a very efficient, smart way. It's a great vehicle that really works."

After consulting with the experts at the Jewish Foundation who offered some tax planning strategies helpful in setting up the fund, the Annette and Ronald z'l Fund was born.

"We started the endowment fund to honour our parents because my dad, in his own right, was extremely community-minded and did so much to help others. My three brothers, my sister and I learned about *tsedakah* from him sitting at the dinner table," Mitchell says with a smile.

And, keeping the Oelbaum tradition of *tsedakah* rolling forward, Mitchell and Naomi's three children are learning about giving at an early age.

"The kids are definitely getting into the spirit of voluntarism and *tsedakah*," says Mitchell. "Daniel and Aaron have already volunteered at UJA telethons and gifts from their respective B'nei Mitzvah all went to charity. It's what we know. It's what we were taught. It's part of our way of life. I'm proud of my children, but then again, it's expected of them."

PLANNING FOR THE FUTURE OF JEWISH TORONTO

When it came to making a positive difference in the future of Toronto's Jewish community, Karen and Sydney Goldenberg couldn't wait to get started.

The philanthropic couple has been rolling up their sleeves on behalf of Jewish Toronto for decades as volunteers and, in Karen's case, professionally as President and CEO of Jewish Vocational Services (JVS), a UJA Federation partner agency.

Both Karen and Sydney were exposed to Jewish values at an early age, with parents who knew the importance of those values, and of making a difference in the community.

"Sydney's father was an outgoing leader in the community; mine was a quiet leader but contributed powerfully in helping many people," relates Karen.

"As a result, we each grew up with an undeniable and proud connection to our Jewish heritage. But, we wonder – and often worry – about the next generation of Jewish life. How will they connect to their Jewish heritage when so much competes for their attention and identity?"

"For so many," Karen adds, "life is more secular and not quite as entrenched in Jewish traditions as it was when we were growing up."

Following in the philanthropic footsteps of Karen's late father, who gifted an insurance policy with which the Jewish Foundation established an endowment fund, Karen and Sydney do more than merely wonder about the future of Jewish life; they have contributed to it by leaving a bequest in their will to the Jewish Foundation.

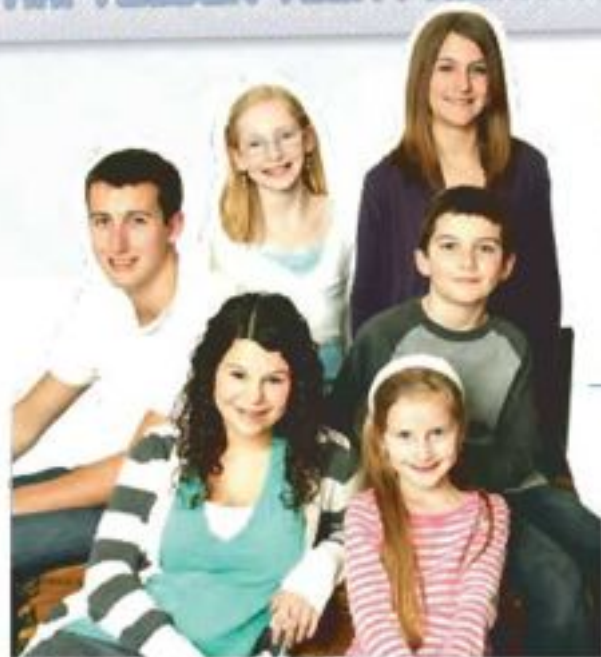
"Jewish life can be so rich in experience if only one reaches out to connect," she explains. "We have to find ways to help make that happen with the next generation. If we don't, who will?"

MAKE YOUR MARK

B'NAI TZEDEK TEEN PHILANTHROPY PROGRAM



An innovative program introducing Bar and Bat Mitzvah aged teens to the value and rewards of *tzedakah* and *tikum olam* by establishing an endowment fund in their own name with a minimum donation of \$1,000.

YOU ARE NEVER TOO YOUNG

"I think it is important to be involved, because it is our responsibility to give back to the community," explains

Maddie Wolfond, who established her fund in 2005. "I know how lucky I am and the idea of making someone else's life a little bit better makes me feel like I've done my part to give back to the world."

In addition to opening a fund, some B'nai Tzedek students designate a portion of their gift to a specific philanthropic project, learning about needs in Toronto and in Israel through discussions with the Jewish Foundation, as was the case with Yael Matlow.

After weighing her options, Yael decided to fund a dance studio in Sderot. "I love to dance," says Yael. "When I was in Sderot, we saw many places that had been destroyed by missiles and I felt so bad. I wanted to make sure that the kids never had to stop dancing no matter what was going on outside." True to her word, Yael and her family traveled to Israel last December with six duffle bags full of dance costumes and shoes collected from the community. "Knowing that I am helping others isn't just a great feeling for me, but also for the children I am helping," she says.

There are currently 80 B'nai Tzedek Youth Philanthropy Funds at the Jewish Foundation of Greater Toronto.

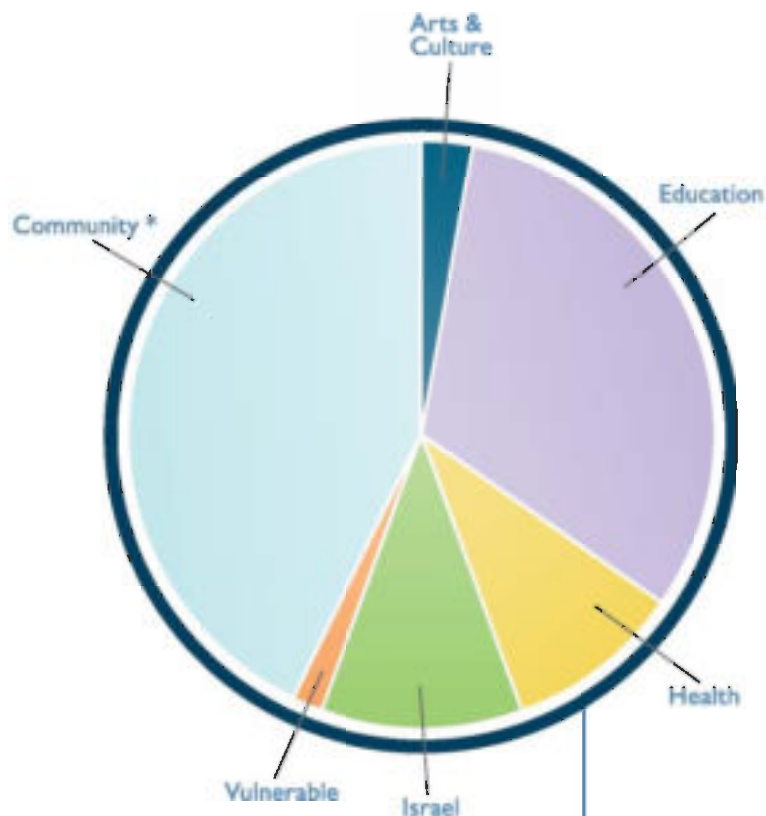
When it comes to *tzedakah* and *tikum olam* (repairing the world), you're never too young to get involved. Toronto's Abrahami, Matlow, and Wolfond children are just a few of the youth philanthropists who are getting an early start when it comes to improving the lives of others.

"It is important for us to be involved in philanthropy because we are fortunate enough to be able to give to others who are less fortunate than we are," explains Reuven Abrahami.

For their special project, the three older Abrahami children - Reuven, 19, Devin, 16, and Aliasa, 13, came up with the idea of funding camp scholarships. "We wanted other children to have the opportunity to enjoy the experience of sleepover camp just like we have had," explains Reuven. The two younger Abrahami children, Arieh, 10 and Mati, 6, plan to follow in their siblings' footsteps in establishing their own B'nai Tzedek funds in the future. "We have learned about helping others and charity by watching our *avta*, Gabi Weisfeld, who has been honoured over the years for her philanthropic involvement."
