B’nai Tzedek is a great way to make new friends and have fun! Collectively, with the support of the B’nai Tzedek team behind you, you really can make a world of difference.



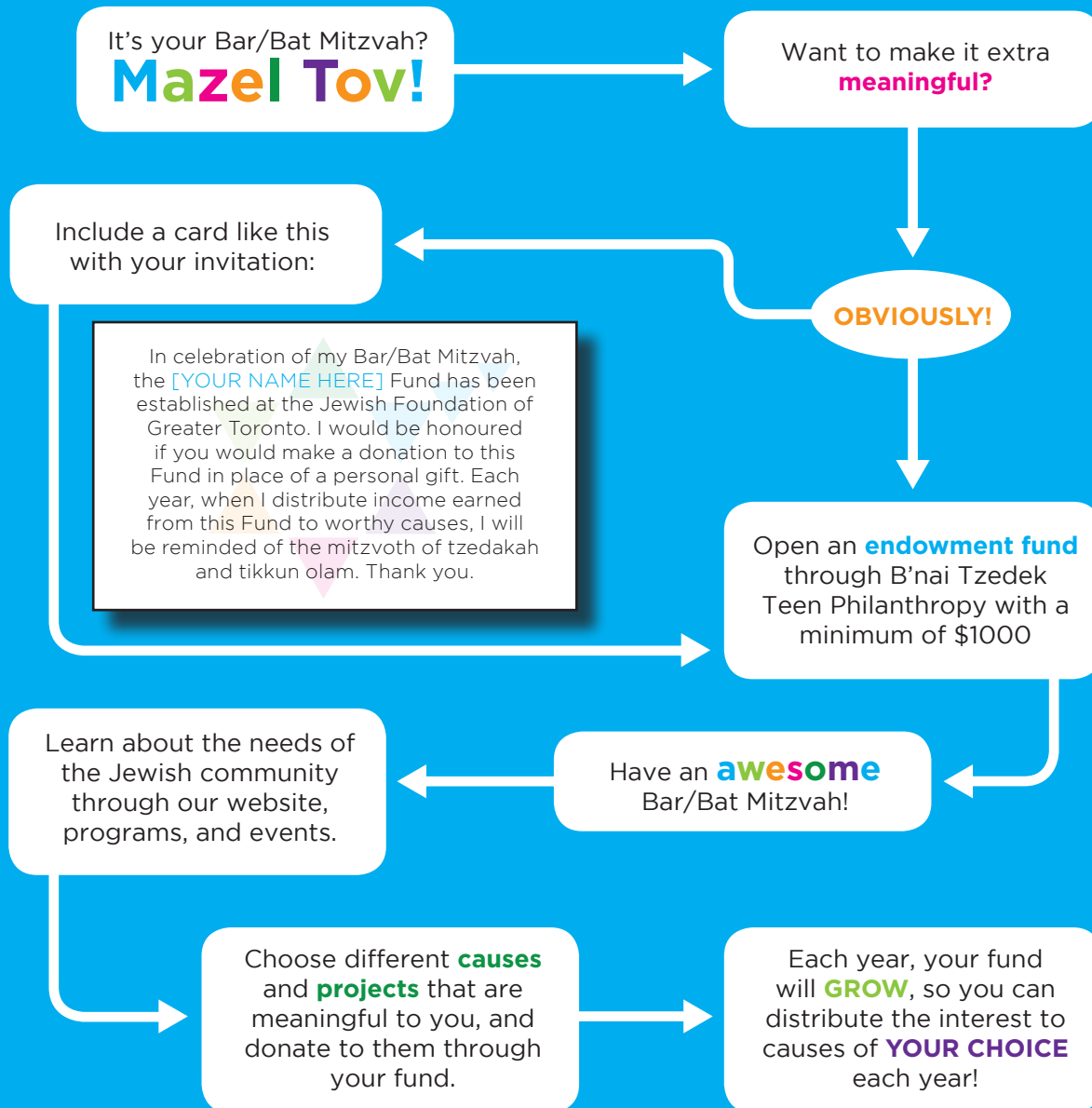
